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13 KERRICK JAMES | HAWAII'S VOLCANOES AND RAINBOWS | MAY 15-21

Balmy breezes and sparkling water conjure images of a tropical paradise. Hawaii, a land of volcanoes and rainbows is also home to painted sea cliffs, waterfalls, unique wildlife and lush tropical forests and expansive beaches.

This workshop, led by world-famous travel photographer Kerrick James, will take you to two of Hawaii's most beautiful islands: Kauai and the Big Island. These spectacular landscapes are among the most beautiful in the world, and you'll learn to capture them, so think casual — water shorts, hiking shoes and dry bags — the perfect way for photographers to discover Mother Nature's masterpieces.

Kauai is known as the garden island and it offers photographers a mix of tropical landscapes, dramatic canyons and beach sunsets. Combined with a bit of light adventure activities, such as kayaking, hiking and zodiac roaming, you'll discover the secrets of photographing stunning landscapes. After arriving in Lihue, Kauai, you'll start the workshop by seeing one of the island's most beautiful features, Waimea

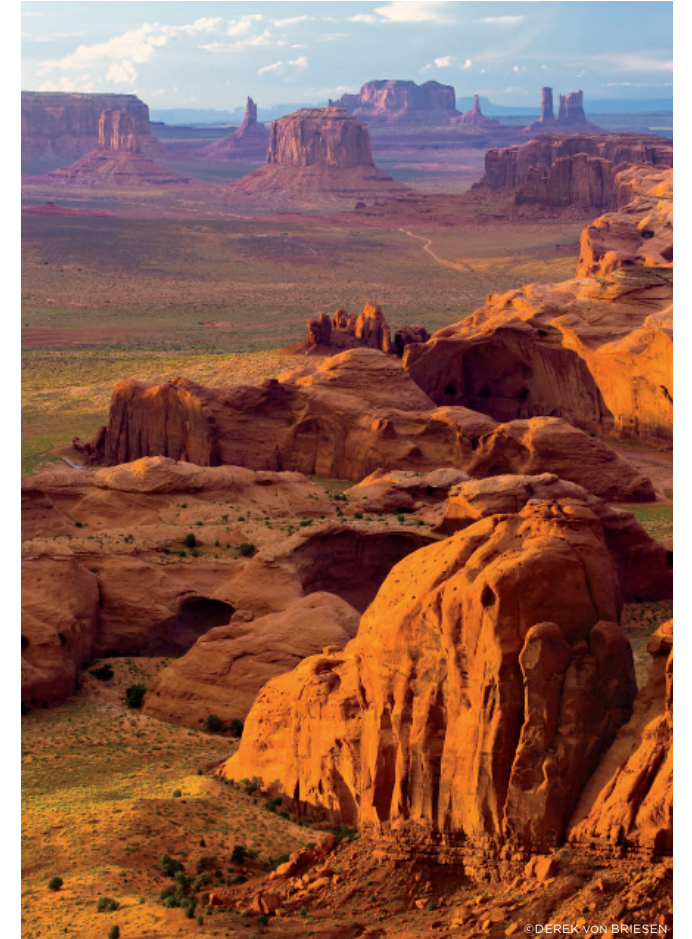
Canyon, which Mark Twain called "The Grand Canyon of the Pacific." A zodiac excursion takes you to the sheer cliffs of the lush Na Pali Coast, and a serene kayak trip along the Wailua River leads to Sacred Falls, one of Kauai's most beautiful sights. On the Big Island, fingers of red-hot molten lava flow into the deep blue waters of the Pacific Ocean. It's a visual testament of the forces of nature and pre-dawn is the best time to capture some extraordinary images. Kerrick will also lead you to Rainbow Falls State Park for some waterfall shots and to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park. Throughout the week, Kerrick will offer instruction on the best way to photograph these natural wonders, as well as critique your work. Hawaii is one of the most beautiful places on Earth and Kerrick will teach you how to create photographs that illustrate the islands' natural magnificence.

14 DEREK VON BRIESEN | HUNT'S MESA AND MONUMENT VALLEY | MAY 21-25

The timeless landscapes of Navajoland offer some of the most unique photographic settings in the country. Wind-swept mesas, massive rock monoliths and rippled sand dunes offer striking subjects for photographers. This workshop is led by Derek von Briesen, who is known for his striking landscape images. During this workshop, you'll see some of the region's most historic locations, such as Cameron Trading Post and Goulding's Lodge. You'll begin the workshop by shooting Monument Valley's iconic rock formations known as The Mittens at both sunrise and sunset. Travel on the Navajo Nation requires a guide and we've arranged for a private tour of Hunt's Mesa, where we'll stay for one evening of primitive camping with a traditional campfire dinner. Our Navajo tour guide may even convey stories and information about the culture and history of the tribe and their land. Photographing from the mesa at sunrise, Derek will show you how to use the sweet light to create dramatic images of the surrounding landscapes from the unique vantage point high on Hunt's Mesa, where you'll gaze down upon the vast expansive landscape. From Hunt's Mesa, you'll return to Monument Valley for a day-long tour of Monument Valley that includes Mystery Valley and Teardrop Arch. You'll have the opportunity to photograph distinctive formations such as Ear of the Wind, Sun's Eye and Totem Pole and Yei Bichei rocks. Finally, you'll visit a traditional Navajo Hogan where weavers pose as they create colorful rugs, and you may even see a Navajo herder driving sheep. Join Derek for this workshop that combines the tradition, culture and stark beauty of Navajoland.
